PARKS PROMOTES YOUTH SAFETY

The Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Huntington Park invited youth to partake in this year's first Skateboarding Demo and Safety Event, which promoted the importance of skateboarding safety to youth through fun recreational activities.

The event took place on April 16, 2016 at Salt Lake Skate Park and was joined by more than 300 skaters. Families and youth enjoyed music, free food, skateboarding demonstrations, safety workshops, and other activities.

Local youth participants helped to promote the importance of wearing helmets and how to properly ride

skateboards within the communities. They also reminded skaters that there are numerous obstacles out in the City and they should be mindful of these items, as well as pedestrians.

In addition to safety information, the event offered free skateboarding competitions, safe skating workshops put on by local youth, and an open "Best Trick" contest for a winning cash prize. Participants were able to win trophies and other prizes provided by event sponsors.

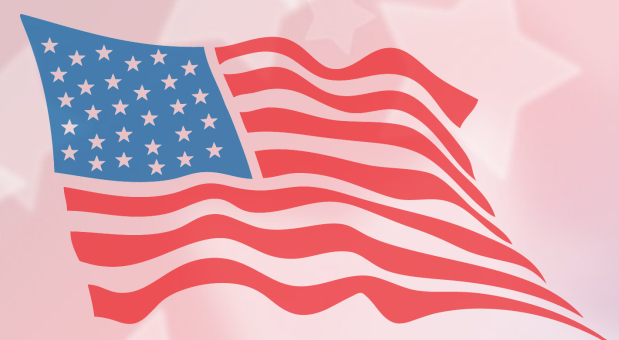
Thousands of participants brought out their bicycles, skates, and running shoes to enjoy the food trucks, entertainment, and activities that were set up along the route.

In addition, this particular CicLAvia event was exceptionally more difficult due to the fact that it spanned multiple jurisdictions. However,

representatives from Huntington Park, Walnut Park, South Gate, Florence-Firestone, Lynwood, and Watts worked closely together to connect their communities for this event.

Event organizers felt that the communities in the area are overlooked and underserved, which often results in residents not having the same access to resources that could better their wellbeing and way of life. The event showcased fitness classes, healthy eating, and other items to promote physical wellbeing.

The entire event was funded by a \$600,000 grant from the Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("Metro"), which was managed by the City of Huntington Park. The grant was divided among the six participating communities to help cover associated costs.

MINOR HOME REPAIR AND LEAD ABATEMENT

Everyone should have the ability to live in a beautiful, healthy home. As such, the Community Development Department of the City of Huntington Park has two programs that seek to improve the homes of residents.

MINOR HOME REPAIR

The Minor Home Repair Program, is funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) federal funds. The Program is designed to provide FREE minor home repair services to eligible low and moderate income households. The program allows home owners to make needed repairs to their homes which otherwise may not have been possible due to financial constraints.

Eligible repairs include:

- Exterior and Interior Repairs (painting, door and window repairs)
- Energy Conservation Activities (weather-stripping doors and windows, and water heater insulation)
- Security/ Safety Improvements (dead bolts, window locks, smoke detectors, and grab bars)
- Exterior Refurbishing (fencing, stucco, and siding repairs)

The Minor Home Repair Program consists of

providing free labor and materials to the elderly, handicapped, and low—moderate income homeowners to make minor home repairs which do not require City permits.

The program provides a direct grant up to \$5,000 to the homeowner for labor and material of the minor repairs to their property.

LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD CONTROL

The City of Huntington Park provides FREE lead grants (up to \$14,440 for owner-occupied properties and up to \$7,500 for rental properties) for lead hazard remediation. Lead hazard control activities include interior and exterior painting, window and door replacement, and other types of abatement.

The Program also promotes education for owners and tenants to help prevent childhood lead poisoning.

GETTING RESIDENTS READY TO TACKLE EMERGENCIES

In partnership with the County of Los Angeles Fire Department, the City of Huntington Park hosted a free training course designed to provide basic training in safety and lifesaving skills to the general public, which would benefit residents in the event of a disaster.

The Community Emergency Response Training, ("CERT") program provided training on using a Fire Extinguisher, First Aid, and how to address basic emergencies close to home and/or the work place, since resources will be spread thin during such an event. Participants had to complete 20 hours of training, including setting up a simulated Triage Center.

The training was led by Engineer Dan Hayashi, Fire-fighter Paramedic Luis Hernandez, Utility Driver Anthony Dixon, and members of Fire Station 165.

Certificates and a CERT backpack with supplies were given to each Graduate.

REPARACIONES MENORES DE SU HOGAR Y DISMINUCIÓN DE PLOMO

Todos los residentes deben tener la posibilidad de vivir en un precioso y saludable hogar. Como tal, el Departamento de Desarrollo Comunitario de la ciudad de Huntington Park tiene dos programas que buscan mejorar las viviendas de los residentes.

REPARACIONES MENORES DE SU HOGAR

El programa de reparaciones menores al hogar está financiado mediante una Subvención Global de Desarrollo Comunitario con fondos federales (CDBG por sus siglas en inglés). El programa está diseñado para proveer acceso gratuito a servicios de reparaciones menores al hogar para personas elegibles de bajos y moderados ingresos. El programa permite a los dueños de casa hacer las reparaciones necesarias a sus hogares, que de lo contrario no habría sido posible debido a limitaciones financieras.

Reparaciones elegibles incluyen:

- Reparaciones al exterior e interior (pintura, reparaciones a puertas y ventanas)
- Actividades de la conservación de energía (sellador/burlete para puertas y ventanas, calentón del agua, y aislamiento)
- Mejorías de protección y seguridad (cerrojo de seguridad, seguros de ventanas, detectores de humo, barras de sostén)
- Renovaciones exteriores (cerca, estuco, reparaciones de revestimientos)

El programa de reparaciones menores al hogar

consiste en proveer mano de obra y materiales gratuita a los propietarios de casa mayores de edad, discapacitadas, y de ingresos bajos y moderados para reparaciones menores que no requieran permisos de la ciudad.

El programa proporciona una subvención directa de hasta \$5,000 para el propietario en mano de obra y materiales para reparaciones menores a sus propiedades.

CONTROL DE RIESGO PARA PINTURA CON BASE DE PLOMO

La ciudad de Huntington Park ofrece subvenciones para disminución de riesgo de plomo GRATUITAMENTE (hasta \$14,400 para vivienda ocupada por sus propietarios y hasta \$7,500 para propiedades de alquiler). Actividades controladas para el riesgo de plomo incluyen pintura en el exterior e interior, reemplazo de ventanas, puertas, y otros tipos de prevenciones.

El programa también promueve la educación para propietarios e inquilinos a ayudar a prevenir el envenenamiento infantil con plomo.

PREPARANDO A LOS RESIDENTES PARA AFRONTAR EMERGENCIAS

En asociación con el cuerpo de bomberos del condado de Los Ángeles, la ciudad de Huntington Park organizó un curso de capacitación gratuito diseñado a impartir formación básica en materia de seguridad y habilidades de salvamento de vidas para el público en general el cual beneficiaría a los residentes en caso de un desastre.

El Entrenamiento Comunitario en Respuesta a Emergencias, (“CERT” por sus siglas en ingles), impartió capacitación sobre el uso de un extintor de incendios, primeros auxilios, y como dirigirse a emergencias básicas cerca de casa y en el trabajo, ya que los recursos se dispersan durante dicho evento. Los participantes tienen que completar 20 horas de capacitación, incluyendo un centro de tratamiento simulado.

La capacitación fue dirigida por el Ingeniero Dan Hayashi, Bombero Paramédico Luis Hernandez, el controlador Anthony Dixon y el cuerpo de bomberos de la estación 165. Certificados y una mochila de



CERT con suministros fueron entregados a cada graduado.

UPW, BULKS FOR BULKIES MAKES IMPACT



United Pacific Waste ("UPW") sponsored "Bulks for Bulkies", a bulky item drop-off event at the City's Public Works Yard on April 19, 2016.

UPW created the event in an effort to raise awareness on illegal dumping in the City of Huntington Park and how to properly dispose of bulky items. The response was tremendous!

Residents brought in 10.98 tons of bulky items in exchange for raffle tickets to win gift cards. Three randomly-selected HP residents were awarded one of three gift cards in the amounts of \$100, \$50, and \$25. The high response has prompted UPW to look into planning for a second "Bucks for Bulkies" event this fall. Residents are invited to look for notices in their trash bill or online at www.hpca.gov.

Huntington Park residents are also reminded that putting a bulky item on the curb or in the alley is in violation of City Code (MC 5-11.05.2). This action is commonly referred to as "illegal dumping". Anyone caught illegally dumping may be subject to a fine.

Residents who live in single family homes may call UPW for a free pick-up of up to four bulky items each week. To make an appointment for pick-up, please call (866) 699-7600.

UPW, BULTOS VOLUMINOSOS HACEN IMPACTO

La empresa de basura, United Pacific Waste ("UPW") patrocinó "Bulk for Bulkies", un evento de entregar bultos voluminosos en el departamento de obras públicas de la ciudad el 19 de Abril de 2016.

La empresa UPW creó el evento con el intento de levantar conciencia de los vertederos ilegales en la ciudad de Huntington Park y como desechar artículos voluminosos. ¡La respuesta fue enorme!

Los residentes trajeron 10.98 toneladas de artículos voluminosos a cambio de boletos de rifas para ganar tarjetas de regalo. Tres residentes de Huntington Park seleccionados a lazar recibieron tarjetas de regalo en la cantidad de \$100, \$50 y \$25 dólares. La respuesta tan favorable ha llevado a la empresa UPW a planificar un

segundo evento de "Bulk for Bulkies" este otoño. Los residentes serán invitados mediante avisos en su factura de basura o en la página web de la ciudad www.hpca.gov.

A los residentes de Huntington Park se les hace un recordatorio que poner artículos voluminosos en la banqueta o callejón es una violación del Código de la ciudad. Esta acción se conoce como "vertedero ilegal". Si se encuentra a los residentes tirando basura ilegalmente, pueden ser sujetos a pago de una multa.
