

**Minutes of the Meeting of the City of Huntington Park

Minutes of Special Meeting held on November 28, 2005:

Discussion and/or action on a new name for the elementary school on State Street:

Mr. Gray stated that a staff report has been submitted to City Council with a request from the Commission to nominate Congresswoman Lucille Roybal-Allard's name for the new elementary school on State Street. It was stated that local residents and various community leaders participate in the voting process for the naming of the school.

Discussion and/or Action on the 5 Cities, 5-a-Day, New Year's Resolution Campaign:

Chairman Loya requested Commissioner Savage to informally take charge of this campaign and assist Marvin Espinoza (M. Ed, Regional Latino & Children's 5 a Day, University of California Cooperative Extension) with the various activities. Commissioner Savage stated that some of the activities will include growing vegetables at the schools, cooking classes for students and parents, walks to the local grocery stores and an exercise program.

Discussion and/or Action of Commissioner Attendance at City Council Meetings:

Following a brief discussion, and there being no objection, Chairman Loya so ordered this item be received and filed.

Status of the Pending Sale of Community and Mission Hospitals:

Commissioner Englanoff stated that escrow is anticipated to close by December 31, 2005. Commissioners Englanoff and Perez are to keep the Commission informed of any further updates.

Status of the New School Development in the City of Huntington Park:


