

Minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Huntington Park held Monday, December 7, 2009.

Following the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, the meeting was called to order in the Council Chambers at 6:00 p.m. by Vice Mayor Noguez. Present: Council Member Elba Guerrero, Council Member Andy Molina, and Vice Mayor Juan R. Noguez. Absent: Council Member Ofelia Hernandez and Mayor Mario Gomez.

Vice Mayor Noguez excused the absence of Mayor Gomez due to illness.

Council Member Hernandez arrived and took her seat at 6:02 p.m.

A parent from Middleton Elementary School informed City Council of their efforts to recycle and displayed various purses made of used plastic bags from local grocery stores. Vice Mayor Noguez opened oral communications, indicating that this was the time for anyone in the audience to address the City Council on any matter of City business.

Claude Bilodeau, representing the General Employees' Association (GEA), informed City Council that the GEA along with the Police Officers' Association (POA) will be conducting their annual toy and food drive again this year and encouraged everyone to get involved by donating towards a good cause.

Don Brabant, President of The Greater Huntington Park Area Chamber of Commerce, informed City Council of the success of their Christmas Parade on Saturday, November 21, 2009 and thanked their staff for doing a great job and the City for their assistance with the event. Mr. Brabant on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce presented a check to Chief of Police Wadley for the Huntington Park Police Explorers and Reserve Officers.

Dante D'Eramo, Executive Director/CEO of The Greater Area Huntington Park Chamber of Commerce, informed City Council that the Christmas Parade will be televised on Channel 56, Los Angeles' Cable Channel LA36, and Huntington Park's Cable Channel 55. Mr. D'Eramo presented City Council with a DVD of the parade and announced that copies of the parade can be purchased for \$15 each at the Chamber of Commerce office. Mr. D'Eramo distributed flyers and invited City Council to see Santa Claus in person and enjoy the free movie "Monsters vs. Aliens" at the Park Theatre on Pacific Boulevard, Saturday, December 12, 2009 at 9:00 a.m., where they will be collecting toys and food for the Salvation Army.

Erica Frausto, Business Improvement District Manager, invited City Council to attend the Santa's Village event along with a technology fair on December 12, 2009.

Lorena Gonzalez, founder and coordinator of the Multitaskers Chapter, informed City Council that she previously applied for the City's Youth Commission but unfortunately was not selected due to residency, therefore she founded the Multitaskers Chapter; and stated that the purpose of this organization is to seek leadership opportunities for the youth. Ms. Gonzalez also informed City Council that this organization is comprised of twelve (12) members who volunteer in the community and introduced Melissa.

Melissa, member of the Multitaskers Chapter, informed City Council of the volunteer work they have done in the community the past six (6) months, including serving food to less-fortunate families; collecting trash at local parks; tutoring children from the Miles Avenue School; and volunteering at the Ronald McDonald House Charities.

Allan Ramirez, member of the Multitaskers Chapter, addressed City Council regarding the Los Angeles Youth Commission and stated that their mission is similar to the Multitaskers Chapter and briefed City Council on their requirements, goals, and ways to be involved.

Francisco Rivera commended the City for doing a great job at removing graffiti. Mr. Rivera informed City Council that he has single-handedly removed advertisements from street poles because they affect the aesthetics of the City and asked City Council how he can become an official City volunteer. Vice Mayor Noguez referred Mr. Rivera to Chief of Police Wadley regarding this matter.

Tom addressed City Council to inquire about employment of residents for the construction of Westside Park in the near future and asked to be considered.

Alex Young, representing the Salvation Army, addressed his concerns to City Council regarding the amount of families in need this Holiday season and asked City Council to assist with this matter by urging neighboring cities to step in and assist with the overflow of less-fortunate families.
