

**Minutes of the Meeting of the City of Huntington Park  
Health and Education Commission

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Present: Commissioners Joe Englanoff, Arlene Savage, Vice Chair Rosa Perez and Chairman Ric Loya. ***Status of the Community and Mission Hospitals:***

Present to address the Commissioners was Chris Doan, General Legal Counsel for Community and Mission Hospital.

Mr. Doan reassured the Commissioners that payroll has been met and that any late fees and/or charges to the employees by their bank due to the previous payroll have been reimbursed. There was a discussion to conduct the next Health and Education meeting at Community Hospital.

***Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on February 27, 2006 and minutes of the Special Meeting held on March 1, 2006:***

A motion was made by Perez, seconded by Savage, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on February 27, 2006 and minutes of the special meeting held on March 1, 2006. The motion was unanimous.

***Discussion and/or action on the Medicare D Forum on April 12, 2006 at Alta Med:***

There was a discussion on the Medicare D Forum, however, no action as taken.

***Discussion and/or action on the City of Los Angeles' latest move to assume control of the Los Angeles Unified School District:***

Ms. Luevano reported that Los Angeles City Mayor Villaraigosa's office reported that they will not have anyone from their staff available to speak on this item until May, 2006. Chairman Loya requested that a copy of the "Feasibility Study of Removing the Schools in the Southeast Area of Los Angeles unified School District from the School District" be given to the Commissioners as well as the City Council.

***Discussion and/or action on the proposed Charter School at 2071 Saturn:***

Mr. Gray stated that the proposed charter school at 2071 Saturn Avenue, will be presented to the Planning Commission on Wednesday, April 5, for recommendation of denial of the proposed project based on planning and land use compatibility concerns and will be considered by the City Council on April 17, 2006. A discussion ensued, however, no action as taken.

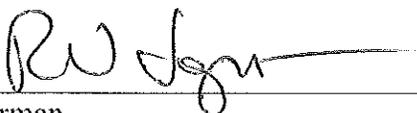
***Discussion and/or Action on the status of a new name for the new elementary school on State Street:***

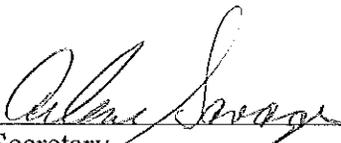
Chairman Loya stated that the school district is revising the policy on the naming of schools. A discussion ensued; however, no action was taken.
