

**Minutes of the Meeting of the City of Huntington Park  
Health and Education Commission  
held June 26, 2006**

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The meeting was held at All Care Medical Group, 2675 Slauson Avenue, and was called to order by Chairman Ric Loya at 6:30 p.m. Present: Commissioners Jorge Morales, Arlene Savage, and Chairman Ric Loya. Absent: Commissioner Joe Englanoff and Vice Chair Rosa Perez. Also in attendance were Director of Community Development Henry Gray, Mayor Juan Noguez, and Recording Secretary Genny Ochoa.

Chairman Loya inquired about the City's policy pertaining to City Commissioners' attendance at Commission meetings. Director Gray stated that staff would provide the Commissioners with the attendance policy as outlined in the Commission Handbook, as presented and modified by the City Council, as soon as it becomes available.

***Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 22, 2006:***

A motion was made by Commissioner Savage, seconded by Commissioner Morales, to approve the minutes of the meeting held on May 22, 2006. The motion was unanimously approved.

***Discussion of New School Development in the City of Huntington Park:***

Chairman Loya stated that LAUSD held a community meeting on June 21 to present the architectural design/layout of the proposed new high school on the City's west side. Mr. Loya stated that the presentation was well received by those in attendance.

***Discussion and/or Action on the Binational Health Week in September 2006:***

A discussion was held in which it was concurred by the Commission that the Health and Education Commission's Health Fair in conjunction with the City's "El Grito" event would be held only on Saturday and Sunday, September 16 and 17. It was agreed by the Commissioners that Commissioner Savage and Noguez would meet with representatives of META 2000 to discuss the logistics of the Commission's participation at the event.

After the discussion, Chairman Loya stated that he and Commissioner Savage would meet with Parks and Recreation staff within the next two weeks to further plan for the Commission's participation at the event.

*Commissioner Englanoff arrived and took his seat at 6:45 p.m.*

***Discussion and/or Action on the City of Los Angeles' latest move to assume control of the Los Angeles Unified School District:***

After a brief discussion on the status of the formation of the Southeast Cities School Coalition Joint Powers Authority (JPA), Chairman Loya stated that he would correspond with the City Council regarding the need for continued dialogue on this important issue, and requested that Director Gray inform the Commission of the JPA meeting scheduling status.

No discussion or action was taken.


***Discussion and/or Action on how the schools in Huntington Park are/or not meeting the educational needs of our students:***


No discussion or action was taken.
