

Subject: **Draft Parks and Recreation Master Plan**

The Parks and Recreation Master Plan is in the final stages of completion. Through the work of Parks and Recreation staff and its consultant, Richard Fisher Associates, the enclosed draft master plan document has been prepared for your review.

It is worthy to note that the Department of Parks & Recreation has made significant headway towards meeting many of the goals outlined in the master plan in the eight months since the beginning of this project. The following is a summary of comments included in the master plan based on public surveys, interviews, community workshops, and the consultant's analysis and recommendations. Following the comments is a summary of relevant actions that have been taken by parks and recreation staff.

Facilities

Comment: The outdoor courts at Salt Lake Park have poor playing surfaces.

Action: The tennis, basketball and volleyball courts at Salt Lake Park underwent a \$250,000 total renovation in August 2007.

Comment: Community workshop participants stated that the Salt Lake Park baseball fields need to be upgraded.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation has contracted Major League Construction to complete infield renovations on baseball diamonds 1, 2 and 3. The renovations, which will be completed in February 2008, will include: laser leveling, resetting field fixtures, amending perimeter radius; and cutting/disposing of unwanted turf and debris. Additionally, the city awarded a contract in December 2007 to renovate the lighting throughout the baseball fields. The project will commence pending the city engineer.

Comment: The restrooms at the Muni building in Salt Lake Park are in poor condition.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation applied for and received a \$198,000 federal HUD grant to renovate the Muni building restrooms. Per the city engineer, the project will commence in spring 2008.

- Comment:* 24% of survey respondents said they want a water play area/splash pad in the city.
- Action:* The city awarded a contract to Ortco, Inc. in September 2007 to construct a splash pad at Freedom Park. Completion of the project is pending the city engineer.
- Comment:* 31% of survey respondents stated that they want additional restrooms in the parks.
- Action:* The new Huntington Park Community Center set to open in January 2008 will include new restroom facilities.
- Comment:* In its review of ADA compliance, the consultant noted that the city is deficient in providing ADA compliant facilities throughout the parks.
- Action:* The Department of Parks & Recreation has purchased eight new picnic tables from Miracle Playground to be installed at Civic Center Park. Three of these tables will be ADA accessible. Installation is scheduled for February 2008.
- Comment:* There needs to be more bilingual park signs in the park.
- Action:* New signs installed at the tennis court are bilingual. The Department of Parks & Recreation also is preparing to make additional signs bilingual in the parks.

Recreation Programs

- Comment:* Community workshop participants and survey respondents stated that there needs to be additional classes and programs offered that build self esteem and promote healthy lifestyles.
- Action:* Parks and Recreation staff has partnered with AltaMed, among other organizations, to provide a variety of new programs and services at the new Huntington Park Community Center set to open in January 2008. Planned programs include, but are not limited, to: youth programs that build healthy relationships, decision making skills, pregnancy prevention education, STD and HIV information, communication building, anger management, college preparation, job skills, financial literacy, support groups, childhood obesity education, and more.
- Comment:* Based on interviews and workshops, the consultants recommend offering English as a Second Language courses.
- Action:* Beginning in November 2007, the Department of Parks & Recreation partnered with the Los Angeles Unified School District to offer free English as a Second Language courses in the Salt Lake Park community center. The program consists of a 10-week course. To date, 64 people have participated in the program.
- Comment:* 33% of survey respondents said they want computer access in community centers.
- Action:* Parks and Recreation staff installed two computers at Freedom Park and two computers at Westside Park in May 2007 that are available for free use by after school program participants. Additionally, there also will be a public computer available at the new Huntington Park Community Center, set to open in January 2008.

Comment: 31% of survey respondents said they want concerts in the parks made available.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation offered the first of the new “Concerts in the Park” concert series in October 2007 at Civic Center Park. Parks and Recreation staff is currently planning the 2008 concert series.

Comment: In a workshop, the Arts & Culture Commission said they want more visual arts programs offered in the city.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation expanded the “Pacific Blvd. Alley Art Show” program to include different art mediums in 2007. Additionally, new art contests for youth, adults and seniors were developed to increase participation among the community. Parks & Recreation staff is currently planning the 2008 “Pacific Blvd. Alley Art Show” series.

Comment: 25% of survey respondents stated they want more dance classes offered.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation added new dance classes to its winter 2007-08 class offerings. These include hip-hop, reggaeton, and zumba. Parks and Recreation staff also is researching additional new activities to offer in subsequent sessions.

General Issues

Comment: Public survey respondents and community workshop participants stated that there is a lack of safety and security in the parks and park users “don’t feel safe.”

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation contracted Alltech Protective Services in October 2007 to provide security at Salt Lake Park, Civic Center Park, and Westside Park.

Comment: 47% of survey respondents said they “do not feel circuses and carnivals are beneficial to the city.” Additionally, community workshop participants stated that the carnivals and circuses “were hard on the parks.”

Action: The Parks and Recreation element of the city’s new special events policy restricts circuses to a maximum of two per year at Salt Lake Park; maximum of two carnivals per year at Salt Lake Park; and maximum of two carnivals per year at Westside Park.

Comment: The consultant recommends that the department place a high priority on collecting data about programs and activities.

Action: The Department of Parks & Recreation purchased and installed RecTrac software in July 2006. This program is used by all staff for program and activity registrations and facility rentals. The program has provided an invaluable source of information about program participants, participation rates, and demographics, among other areas.
