

WRI is qualified, licensed and authorized to do business in the State of California and the County of Los Angeles and will acquire the necessary city permits required to do business within the City of Huntington Park. There is one individual who owns more than 10% of WRI’s equity. Kosti Shirvanian owns more than 10% of WRI’s equity since the Company’s inception.



Team Experience

Waste Resources, Inc. (WRI) is an experienced and reputable integrated waste management company in California and Hawaii. Kosti Shirvanian, our Chairman and Co-Founder was the Founder, President and Chairman of the Board of Western Waste Industries. Khoren Shaginian our President/CFO and Co-Founder was formerly with Coopers & Lybrand, Tommy Gendal, our Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer and Co-Founder, was the Western Region Operations, Vice President of Western Waste Industries.

Western Waste was the largest waste management company in California and the 4th largest waste management company in the USA. Western Waste began operations in 1955 and operated over 100 municipal contracts, owned, developed, permitted and operated 11 landfills, 15 MRF's, 22 transfer stations and 9 composting facilities before its merger with USA Waste, who later changed their name to Waste Management Inc. In California, Western Waste owned, developed, permitted and operated the El Sobrante Landfill in Riverside, the Recyclery in San Jose, the Smart Station in Sunnyvale, the Carson Transfer Station, the Redondo Beach Recycling Center the Redondo Beach Buy-Back Center and the Chino Recycling Center, Chino Composting Facility and the Fresno MRF and Transfer Station. At the time, Western Waste and Southern Pacific Railroad created the partnership for rail haul to Eagle Mountain and Goldfield Mines which today is owned by the LA County Sanitation District.



WRI has been servicing the cities of Gardena, since 2003, and Lynwood, since 2013. WRI is the exclusive franchisee for these cities for integrated solid waste management services for residential, commercial and industrial sectors. WRI provides automated residential refuse, recyclable materials and green waste collection along with commercial refuse, recycling bin and roll off service. Type of services provided include cart, permanent and temporary bins, permanent and temporary roll off, bulky item collections for residential and commercial customers, gratis refuse and recycling service for City facilities and city sponsored special events, diversion reporting, annual Cal Recycle reporting, public education and awareness programs.







WRI will provide new Rehrig Pacific carts. Upon delivery all carts will include a “new service packet” describing all the services to be provided and directions on proper loading of the carts, bulky item program, sharps program, WRI contact info, holiday schedule and other important data made available to the residents.

Carts shall be labeled on the inside in English and Spanish and with graphics as required by this RFP. Additionally, information will be included in form of a decal regarding the city approved bulky waste program.



Carts will be labeled outside with WRI’s phone number on the sides, cart serial number on the front and waste stream type in English and Spanish on the lid.

The body of the Refuse Carts shall be a uniform gray color, Recycling Carts shall be a uniform blue color and Green Waste Carts shall be a uniform green color.

Commercial Bins

WRI will provide the required size bins for commercial services. Bins storing Refuse will be colored Orange. Bins for Recyclable materials will be Blue. Bins for Green Wastes or organics will be Green.



WRI will have both plastic and metal bins available for Huntington Park customers. All bins will have split lids and wheels where necessary. Plastic bins are used for moist wastes such as found at restaurants. These bins are quieter, lighter, maintain their water-tightness and clean easier. Bins will be sized to match the RFP’s requirements. Metal bins are manufactured by UST and Consolidated Fabricators. Plastic bins are manufactured by Rehrig Pacific.

Bin Cleaning

WRI shall steam clean or replace bins upon customer request once per year at no additional charge. WRI may charge an approved fee for additional cleanings prior to annual cleanings or replacements.

Roll Off Boxes

WRI has a huge inventory of open top roll off boxes sized form 10-50 cubic yard capacity. All boxes are constructed of metal and are the color orange.



WRI has met and has prepared UST and Consolidated Fabricators regarding those customers who do not own compactor receiver boxes that are customized to fit their compacting unit.

Exhibit 5 – Multi-Family Dwelling Recycling Program

WRI will collect recycling and solid waste from Multi-Family dwellings as frequently as scheduled by the customer, up to six (6) times per week but not less than once per week. Waste Resources shall provide consultative services -- at no additional charge -- to Multi-Family dwelling customers to assist in setting up effective recycling and waste minimization programs in fulfillment of AB341 and AB939 goals.

Containers

WRI will offer Multi-Family facilities the option of subscribing to cart, bin, drop box, or compactor service. We will provide one or more containers to such premises as requested by customer that no less than ninety-six (96) gallons of Container capacity is provided for every four (4) dwelling units in the complex. WRI will collect solid waste from containers at a location selected by the customer (approved by the City). Individual residents will each be provided one container to place within their unit for collecting commingled recyclables.

All carts and containers will include bilingual decals with simple directions of what may be placed in the cart or bin as further described and pictured in Section 2.4 Commercial Recycling Program which follows.

Bin Cleaning

WRI shall steam clean or replace bins upon customer request once per year at no additional charge. WRI may charge an approved fee for additional cleanings prior to annual cleanings or replacements.

Access

WRI will open and close gates, push and/or pull containers, lock and unlock containers, or perform other services as reasonably necessary to assess and empty the containers. WRI will charge a separate "scouting" fee for these bin services per customer's request.

Multi-Family On-Call Clean-Up Services

WRI will provide Multi-Family customers with up to four (4) on-call clean-up services per year per complex at no additional cost. WRI will deliver one three (3) cubic yard bin for the storage and collection of materials placed by waste generators. This service will be provided in the same manner as the Bulky Item Collection Services described for Single Family customers, with the following exceptions:

- WRI on-call collection services will be arranged by the Multi-Family customer or Property Manager.
- Service will be provided to the entire Multi-Family complex – and not just the individual Residential unit.

WRI will arrange the dates of delivery and pickup of the bin with the customer or property manager. Additional pickups (unscheduled) will be made available as



negotiated by customer or property manager and Waste Resources, based on capacity needs and any such arrangements will reflect payment of the appropriate franchise fee.



Exhibit 6 – Commercial Recycling Program

WRI will collect recycling and solid waste from Commercial premises as frequently as scheduled by the customer, up to six (6) times per week but not less than once per week. With the exception that non-putrescible materials that have been segregated for collection in bins may be collected less often than once per week.

Containers

WRI will offer Commercial premises the option of subscribing to Cart, Bin, Drop Box, or Compactor service. WRI will collect solid waste from containers at a location selected by the Customer and approved by the City. Commercial solid waste collection will be performed at a time within allowable collection hours.

All carts and containers will include bilingual decals with simple directions of what may be placed in the cart or bin.

WRI will allow each Commercial Customer to select a collection service methodology that best suits the needs of its facility. Specifically, Waste Resources will offer the following collection service methodologies to Commercial Customers:

Individual Cart or Bin Services. WRI will allow each Commercial facility to use Carts or Bins for Recycling and Solid Waste Collection. WRI will provide each Customer with a choice of one or more Carts with capacities ranging of 64 or 96 gallons (or similar sizes approved by the City) or Bins with capacities ranging from 2 to 6 cubic yards (or similar sizes approved by the City).

Centralized Bin or Cart Services. WRI will allow each Commercial facility to use Carts or Bins for Recycling and Solid Waste Collection that are shared by the Occupants of two (2) or more adjacent Commercial premises. In such case, Waste Resources will provide one (1) or more Carts or Bins as requested by Customer(s) provided that no less than 96 gallons (or similar volume) of Container capacity is provided for every four (4) Commercial premises. WRI will provide each Customer with a choice of one or more Carts with capacities of 64 or 96 gallons (or similar sizes approved by the City) or Bins with capacities ranging from 2 to 6 cubic yards (or similar sizes approved by the City).

Drop Boxes and Large Compactors. WRI will allow a Customer to use a Drop Box or Compactor with a roll-off Compactor Container for Recycling and Solid Waste Collection to meet the Customer's Collection needs. In such case, WRI will provide Customer with a choice of Container capacities ranging from 10 to 50 cubic yards (or similar sizes approved by the City). WRI will offer Customers the option to purchase or lease Compactors through either WRI or an outside vendor.

Access

WRI will open and close gates, push and/or pull containers, lock and unlock containers, or perform other services as reasonably necessary to access and empty the containers. WRI will charge a separate "scout or push-out" fee for these bin services per customer's request.



Recycling

WRI has devised a successful commercial recycling program with the “pay as you throw” premise. Basically, if a commercial enterprise does not want to initiate recycling at their location then they will have to pay for it. You will notice our commercial rates for 1x per week service has remained the same. However, the multiple days’ service has increased. Bins for recycling will be discounted 50% of the commercial rates. It is WRI’s belief that commercial customers will initiate recycling programs and or improve and enhance their current recycling participation due to the hard economics of not doing so. Recycling will improve their bottom line and all our environment. The more GREEN they are, the more GREEN they get!

AB341

WRI will provide consultative services -- at no additional charge -- to commercial and industrial customers to assist in setting up effective recycling and waste minimization programs in fulfillment of AB341 and AB939 goals.

AB939 and AB341 Compliance Services

WRI acknowledges that the City of Huntington Park’s current mandated diversion goal is 50%, and that commencing on January 1, 2020, this 50% diversion goal increases to 75%. WRI will implement the programs identified in the Source Reduction and Recycling Element (SRRE) and the Household Hazardous Wastes Element (HHWE) of the City’s General Plan immediately. And we will implement additional SRRE/HHWE programs required by amendments, or as necessary.

Waste Resources will provide the City with monthly, quarterly, and annual written reports in a manner that meets the City’s AB939 and AB341 obligations. WRI will help City meet filing and reporting requirements to the State (CalRecycle) and the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works Environmental Programs Division. WRI will prepare reports for the City to meet and exceed its commitments and AB939 / AB341 compliance requirements.

WRI will maintain a database for the City detailing all businesses generating over 4 cubic yards per week and Multi-Family complexes of 5 units or more in order to track progress with implementation of AB341 commercial recycling programs. The franchise hauler’s source separated bin collection and MRFing diversion, as well as 3rd party recycling and self haul will be monitored for easy compliance reporting purposes. Integrating our education and outreach programs with the AB341 monitoring database will enable us make regular compliance reports to the City and CalRecycle on Huntington Park’s progress with commercial waste diversion.

WRI will provide consultative services -- at no additional charge -- to commercial, industrial, and multi-family customers to assist in setting up effective recycling and waste minimization programs in fulfillment of AB341 and AB939 goals.



Office Recycling Bins

When WRI representatives meet with Huntington Park business they will offer office recycling programs that fit the commercial recycling programs offered. WRI provides desk top/desk side recycling bins for the collection of mixed office waste paper. These will be emptied by designated staff of the office site into WRI provided recycling carts or bins.

Disposal or Diversion Facilities

Waste Resources Recovery MRF & Transfer Facility

WRI will transport all residential and commercial refuse, recycling and green waste to its Waste Resources Recovery (WRR) facility which is a Material Recovery Facility (MRF) and Transfer Station located at 357 W. Compton Blvd, Gardena, California 90247. WRR shall process all three streams of waste, inspect and remove hazardous wastes and contaminants from the streams then will transport each stream to the proper site for diversion credits.



Our facility is fully permitted and inspected by CalRecycle and Los Angeles County Environmental Health to ensure compliance. Potential Recycling and Rock Tenn Recycling currently collects all clean recycling commodities from the WRR facility.

All bulky loads will be delivered to WRR for disassembly and commodity sorting so to increase landfill diversion.

All residuals from recycling will be transported to Chiquita Canyon Landfill where WRR has a long term disposal agreement.

Waste Resources Recovery is located less than 9 miles from the City of Huntington Park.

Clean, dedicated source separated loads will be delivered to various recycling facilities. As an example, clean wood loads will be delivered to B&B pallets in Compton. Sawdust will be delivered to Amigos nurseries in LA and Color Spot nurseries in Carson.

Construction bins and roll off loads will be delivered to California Waste Services (CWS) in Gardena for diversion credits.

Green wastes will be transported to WRR for polishing and then transferred to Clean Green Technologies in South Gate for processing into compost.

WRI transports C & D wastes to California Waste Services located at 621 W. 152 Street, Gardena, 90247. California Waste Services will guarantee space for Huntington Park C & D wastes.

WRR Expansion

In 2012 WRR has submitted an application to LA County Regional Planning (File #: R2012-00880) for 2500 tpd expansion, preparing for the closure of Puente Hills Landfill.

WRR is permitting a waste processing facility that will recover recyclable commodities and separate residuals into organic and inorganic fractions.

- Inorganic waste fraction shall be transported for use as road base or construction materials and as a last resort, landfilled.
- Organic waste will be transported to an Anaerobic Digestion (AD) facility that WRI is developing locally.

This process will dramatically increase the facility diversion rate from 20% to 85%. WRI anticipates surpassing the City's 75% diversion goal earlier than required. WRR will reserve and guarantee capacity to satisfy the needs of Huntington Park for the term of the Agreement.

The simplest way to attain Customer and container size data is from the current hauler's database. We recommend the City request this from its haulers before award. WRI will meet with your current hauler and understand their exit strategy so we may both smoothly transition. Concurrently, WRI will be obtaining information from its Commercial route audits and executed service agreements. To accomplish the route audits, WRI will assemble four teams of two persons to gather routing and customer information. The gathered information will be the most current and supersede any data collected from the hauler.

During these customer meetings, route auditors will introduce the Company and impress upon the customer what our recycling goals are. This is an important step for increased participation for residential, multi-family and commercial recycling. It is at this time WRI will know to deliver a second bin for recycling only or cart services for space challenged locations.

Finalized audit information and signed serviced agreements will be input into the database, matched against other available information received for discrepancies which must be investigated and resolved.

In the event of absent cooperation from the hauler, WRI will take full responsibility for collecting and delivering all residential and commercial containers.

Contingency Plan for Uncooperative Hauler: This is an unfortunate situation should it develop, however, rest assured WRI is experienced and ready for such a contingency and it will ensure a smooth transition and implementation for Lynwood. We have discussed and prepared our vendors to allow us to use their stock cart and container inventories. WRI has the trained drivers and the necessary CNG equipment ready to roll tomorrow should the need arise.

WRI will operate four (4) residential trucks on a daily basis for the collection of residential wastes. WRI will also deploy a 2 man flat bed truck daily for bulky waste collections as described in the bulky waste program.

Based on the amount of bins required per this RFP, WRI will operate three (3) front end loaders six (6) days weekly supported by two (2) scout vehicles. We have not identified any seven (7) day weekly accounts as of yet.


Per our surveys, WRI will operate one (1) full time roll off truck to service Lynwood and will have on standby another roll off truck should the demand arise.

Transition Experience

WRI's team has successfully conducted over 50 municipal contract transitions throughout the nation.

In the 80's it was this team that transitioned the City of Huntington Park integrated waste services when we owned and operated Western Waste Industries.

Locally, in addition to a Huntington Park transition, WRI's team members successfully completed transitions for the cities of Carson, Compton, Redondo Beach, Manhattan Beach, Lawndale, Inglewood and most recently, the City of Gardena and the City of Lynwood.

WRI's City of Gardena transition and implementation was well organized and focused emphasizing communication with the City. WRI provided trained bilingual customer service agents positioned at city hall to assist with phone calls and questions pertaining to the new waste and recycling services. WRI currently has an inventory of metal and plastic commercial containers ranging from 1-6 cubic yards and also has an inventory of roll off containers ranging from 10-50 cubic yards at its operating yard located at 850 E. 111th Place, Los Angeles, California. WRI has alerted Rehrig Pacific about the status of this RFP. Rehrig Pacific assures WRI that equipment (carts and bins) will be delivered 6-8 weeks after order is confirmed. If the RFP remains on schedule, equipment will be received in time for the commencement date.

As of the writing of this proposal WRI has ordered six new CNG vehicles, 3 automated side loaders and 3 front end loaders at its operating yard. Within one month we will also receive 2 more new CNG vehicles, 1 automated side loader and 1 front end loader. MINIMUM RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS

WRI will make its best effort to divert wastes from landfills. Waste delivered from landfills is an archaic way of handling residuals from recycling programs not to mention groundwater contamination, air quality and GHG issues.

WRI will meet the target rates presented in the RFP. WRI recommends that the City of Huntington Park removes itself from LARA. WRI will assist the City with all AB 939 & 341 compliance requirements and obligations.

WRR's expansion and waste recovery and conversion technology project is expected to begin operating January 1, 2015. When this facility is fully operational we expect landfill diversion rates of over 85%, certainly the highest in the County of Los Angeles.

Diversion for residential customers starts with proactive Public Education and Awareness programs. This outreach begins prior to cart delivery with local workshops, mail marketing, City and WRI websites linked to YouTube posts specifically for Huntington Park residents and cable TV advertising.

Residential carts are delivered with bilingual "under lid" decals which uses graphics to guide residents what to place in the carts along with a new service provider kit that explains the proper placement of carts, service days, holiday schedule and the do's and don'ts for each colored carts.

WRI will also be publishing in its initial recycling literature that it will distribute to residents as part of its public education program, that residents will now be allowed to recycle Aseptic Milk Cartons and various types of Aseptic juice and liquid food cartons. Bulky items and E-Waste will be delivered to WRR for disassembly and recycling.

E-waste and Universal Waste will be collected "on-call" free to residents of Huntington Park and included in the bulky waste program.

Residential green wastes will be routed to WRR for polishing and then transferred, depending on quality, to Amigos Nursery, Agromin and/or Chiquita Canyon Landfill.

C&D roll off loads will be routed to California Waste Services MRF at a diversion rate of 70%. Inert loads will be routed to local inert disposal points. Recycling roll off loads will be transported to multiple recycling locations determined by daily market prices. Dedicated carpet loads will be delivered to LA Fibers in Vernon. Dedicated wood loads will be delivered to B&B Pallets in Compton.

On an on-going basis, commercial customers are regularly contacted by our Recycling Specialist to assist them to help reduce waste. We evaluate existing programs and make improved adjustments or set-up new programs. With all the challenges and priorities our customers face in business, waste is not at the top of their lists, but profit is. That's why WRI



regularly contacts customers via mail marketing, print and media advertising, workshops, awards programs and site visits to discuss waste minimization and cost management.

Interns from the Huntington Park School District and trained by WRI, may assist us in the monitoring of both residential and commercial waste streams searching for contaminants, improving the quality of materials and learn how to properly interact with the public in the world of environmental management.

We give our customers very good reasons to look in their carts and dumpsters:

- Potential Cost Savings
- Convenient Service Options
- Resource Conservation
- State Requirement to Reduce Waste (AB341)
- Environmental Issues and Safety

For several years, WRI has been actively involved in helping our commercial customer base start and expand waste prevention and recycling programs. By diverting recyclables from the waste stream, costs for disposal can be significantly reduced. Keeping these commodities out of the trash will cut down on the number of waste bins needed and limit the frequency of pickups.

WRI's commercial recycling infrastructure is in place and already operating.

WRR's expansion and conversion project is expected to begin operating January 1, 2015. When this facility is operational we expect diversion rates of over 85%. At that time residuals left from recycling will be processed into marketable commodities improving Huntington Park's environment and economy.

WRR EXPANSION

Waste Resources Recovery Facility is current sits on 2½ acres in unincorporated LA County neighboring cities of Gardena, Carson and Compton. WRR is permitted to recycle and transfer 500 tons of materials per day. WRR has acquired an additional 4 acres.


This 6½ acre facility has applied for expansion for up to 2500 tons per day of materials. At this facility, and as part of the expansion application, 400 tons per day of post-recycled solid organic waste will be converted to refuse derived fuel (RDF). This RDF will be transported to a local AD Facility where Biogas will be collected and processed and converted to synthetic natural gas.

This gas can be directly used as a fuel to feed generators creating electricity. Also, biogas can be liquefied then refined into multiple fuels as kerosene, gasoline, diesel and compressed natural gas (CNG). Operation of the expansion project is scheduled to begin soon.

Commercial Recycling 101

The State of California passed Assembly Bill 341, requiring mandatory commercial recycling starting July 1, 2012.

What do the State's mandatory commercial recycling regulations require?

Assembly Bill 341 requires all businesses that generate 4 cubic yards of commercial solid waste per week and multi-family properties with 5 units or more (such as apartments) to arrange for recycling service starting on and after July 1, 2012 through one of the following:

- 🗑️ Subscribe to service that collects recyclables separately, or
- 🗑️ Send materials to mixed waste processing facility that diverts recyclables, or
- 🗑️ Self-haul your own recyclables



(WRR Team Members Sorting Commodities at MRF)

What recycling services are available to ensure I comply with the new law?

All customers that are subject to the State's mandatory commercial recycling regulation will receive one of the following at no additional charge:

- 🗑️ One cubic yard recycling bin/capacity;
- 🗑️ Two 96 gallon recycling carts due to storage constraints;
- 🗑️ Processing at a mixed waste processing facility to recover recyclables

Additional recycling containers, capacity and frequency will be offered at half the rate for the same type of trash collection service.

Are recycling services available for customers not subject to the mandatory commercial recycling regulation such as single family properties, multi-family properties (less than 5 units) and businesses that generate less than 4 cubic yards?

Yes, the same recycling service above will be provided to customers upon request.



Is Recycling Mandatory?

Yes, starting July 1, 2012, businesses that generate 4 cubic yards or more of waste per week and multi-family properties (5 units or more) must recycle. As your commercial franchise waste hauler, we will assist you in ensuring you meet the requirement by providing free and convenient recycling service.

How can I arrange for recycling service?

Please contact our customer service department at 888-467-7600 between 7 am to 5 pm, Monday to Friday to arrange for recycling services. Also, we will conduct a free on-site evaluation aimed at starting or enhancing recycling activities on your premises. The visit will help customize recycling service and containers to meet your needs.



BLUE = RECYCLING
This cart is for clean commingled recyclables, including cardboard, newsprint, office paper, empty aluminum/tin cans, plastic containers #1 – 7, glass bottles/jars. **No garbage or yard trimmings in this cart please.**



GREEN = YARD TRIMMINGS
Place Yard Trimmings in the Green Cart. This includes grass, leaves, and small branches less than 3 inches thick. **No dirt, sand, stones, concrete, or building materials.**



GRAY = GARBAGE
Place "Everything Else" or Garbage in the Gray Cart. **No hazardous or universal/electronic wastes in carts.**

Place all carts by curbside by 7:00 a.m. on your regularly scheduled service day. Collection should be completed by 7:00 p.m.

Lids should be closed preventing litter being blown onto the street. Lid opening should face toward the street.

Carts should be placed side by side at least two (2') feet apart and three (3') feet from parked vehicles or objects. As a courtesy to your neighbors, promptly remove carts after service.

Maximum Weight Limits: 64 gallons = 220 lbs. To avoid having an overweight cart possibly causing damage to the cart or truck and surroundings, do not place rocks, concrete, bricks, or dirt into carts. All items inside cart must fall out when the cart is emptied, so please don't overfill the cart by tightly packing it. If the cart is unserviceable, your collector will leave a warning notice and mark the reason why. Please correct the problem for your next week's collection.

If one of these holidays falls on your service day, WRG will service you on the next business day.

Valet Service - For physically challenged residents with State of California handicapped placards, WRG shall collect from side or rear yard (location convenient to resident), at no additional charge. Such physically challenged residents shall provide WRG with verification that they have a State of California handicapped placard and shall also provide permission to WRG employees to enter upon their property for the purpose of transporting and emptying waste carts. Contact WRG to request a Valet Service Application.

If my garbage/recycling cart is damaged, or missing. What do I do?

From time to time maintenance is required on the garbage/recycling collection carts. Call WRG customer service at 888-467-7600 to request repair or replacement. A supervisor will assess the cart's condition. If it is beyond repair due to normal wear and tear, or was damaged while being serviced, the cart will be repaired free of charge. If a cart was stolen, the resident must present a police report in order to have it replaced free of charge. Carts will not be replaced for free when damaged by vandalism or abuse (a fee of \$71.51 will apply in these cases).

Scavenging in Gardena is Against the Law!

The theft of recyclable materials from carts can lead to increased cost of recycling collection service. Report the crime by contacting the Gardena Police Department (310) 323-7911, and if you see illegal dumping of solid waste, please call the City (310) 217-9568 to report it so that the items can be removed safely.

Multi-Family Dwelling Public Education Programs

The most successful solid waste management programs start with well-informed customers and participants. WRI will inform the residents and businesses of Huntington Park of their new solid waste programs with highest possible level of public education and awareness.

We will prepare and distribute an initial mailing to Multi-Family residential customers explaining the change from the previous hauler to WRI, including the effective date as well as, changes to recycling programs, carts and bins, or service dates, etc., if applicable. Residents will receive a bilingual “how to” flyer illustrating:

- how to prepare recyclable materials for collection;
- the proper setout procedures for containers;
- and pictures with text to show specific materials that go in recycle bin, and which items don't belong.

Multi-Family Dwelling (MFD) outreach materials will be similar to Single Family Dwelling materials, with the exception that MFD outreach will not discuss yard waste collection. Our outreach personnel will meet with apartment managers, homeowner associations and other groups to promote and explain WRI's recycling and solid waste programs. Property managers will be offered “move-in” kits with helpful tips for new tenants. Posters and signage will be made available to display in bin areas, and the laundry or community room.

Seasonal brochures/ newsletters will be mailed to all residents on a quarterly basis that creatively inform residents of such topics, as availability of on-call cleanup, bulky item collection, proper handling of HHW, E-waste, and U-waste, and environmental conservation. If the City and franchise hauler agree to provide alternative outreach methodology, WRI will make program adjustments such as walking the neighborhood and providing door hanger “recycling reminders” to tenants, or placing articles in property manager's newsletter.

Commercial Public Education Programs

Our customer outreach personnel will meet with chamber of commerce groups, business associations and other groups to promote and explain WRI's recycling and solid waste programs. WRI will annually provide businesses with flyers/newsletters detailing what commercial recycling program offers, how to comply with AB341, and other green news. Newsletters will remind businesses that WRI gladly offers free recycling technical assistance and personal site evaluations.



These days the internet is becoming the best way to reach people. WRI will utilize web-based social media to bring our message to the residents and businesses of Huntington Park. Our company's website will have a designated webpage for use by our City of Huntington Park customers. Customers can download helpful brochures, watch instructive youtube videos, pay bills online, and see calendar of upcoming events in the City of Huntington Park.

Huntington Park's residents and businesses will be able to call or email WRI requests for information or bulky item pickups, and our customer service representatives will respond with direct advice and timely answers.



Exhibit 17 – Residential Sharps Collection Program

Home-generated needles and other sharps thrown into household waste present a great risk to sanitation and sewage treatment workers, janitors, housekeepers, children – and even pets. Some state governments are setting guidelines about needle waste disposal. California, for example, now prohibits disposal of needles in regular household waste.

Huntington Park residents will be able to conveniently and responsibly dispose of needles, lancets, and other sharps from homes with mail-back containers in three easy steps:

- Step 1: Residents call WRI at (888) 467-7600 to request a free Sharps Kit (includes a container, a pre-paid postage label and a form). WRI will deliver it to your home the following week.
- Step 2: Residents fill up the container with Sharps.
- Step 3: Residents mail the container back for safe disposal by using the pre-paid postage label provided and sign the form included in side pocket of the kit.



Residents will receive one free Sharps Mail-Back Kit, with a second kit, third, and so on available for \$10.00 co-pay each time. Limit one kit at a time.

WRI receives a certificate after the container has been properly emptied and documents that the sharps were safely and completely processed and uploads that information on the customer's account data for future review and reference. Following are samples of that document:

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Many common household products are hazardous. If these products are handled or disposed of incorrectly, they can pose a threat to human health, animals and the environment. When these products are discarded, they become “household hazardous waste.” In California, it is illegal to dispose of household hazardous waste in the trash, down the drain, or by abandonment.

HHW must be disposed of through a Household Hazardous Waste Program. Examples of HHW are paint, motor oil, solvents, pool chemicals, universal and electronic wastes. Residents are encouraged to call (888) CLEAN-LA or visit www.888cleanla.com to locate where hazardous waste can be dropped off. HHW may be dropped off at Waste Resources Recovery located at 357 W.
