Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order:

Through our Safer at Home efforts, we've collectively slowed the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Los Angeles County, allowing for a phased reopening of some businesses and public spaces. However, COVID-19 remains a serious risk. Please continue to practice social (physical) distancing and wear a facemask whenever you are around others, and to wash your hands frequently. Also, remember to stay home if you are sick or if you have been in close contact with someone who is sick.

The following are examples of public sites that are open and temporarily closed under the Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order. This is a partial list only and when at these sites, you must follow requirements to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Click on the links to learn about these requirements.

Recreation, Entertainment, and Learning

CAN BE OPEN

- Parks (Playgrounds are closed.)
- Pools in Multi-Unit Residential Facilities (e.g., Apartments, Condominiums, and Homeowner's Associations)
- Pickleball and Tennis Courts
- Vehicle-Based Parades
- Outdoor/Recreation Equipment Rentals (e.g., Bikes, Kayaks, and Paddleboards)
- Libraries (For Curbside Pick-up Only)
- Outdoor Museums, Open Air Galleries, Botanical Gardens, and Other Outdoor Exhibition Space

CLOSED FOR NOW

- Recreation and Community Centers
- Basketball and Volleyball Courts
- Baseball and Soccer Fields
- Youth Sports Leagues
- Gyms/Fitness Centers, including in Multi-unit Housing
- Public Pools
- Bars and Nightclubs that Don't Serve Food
- Arcades, Bowling Alleys, Movie Theaters, Live Performance Theaters, Concert Halls and Venues, Stadiums, Arenas, Gaming Facilities, Theme Parks, and Festivals

Shopping, Restaurants, and Personal Care

CAN BE OPEN FOR IN-STORE SHOPPING/SERVICES

- Grocery Stores, Certified Farmers' Markets, Farm and Produce Stands, Supermarkets, Food Banks, Convenience Stores, Wholesale Clubs, and Pharmacies
- Stores that Sell Products Needed for Your Home, such as Hardware, Building, Home Appliance, and Pool Supply Stores
- Lower-Risk Retail Stores, such as Bookstores, Jewelry Stores, Furniture Stores, Toy Stores, and Clothing Stores
- Pet Food Stores, Animal Daycare and Boarding Facilities, and Veterinary Clinics
- Hair Salons and Barber Shops, for Certain Services Only (i.e., The employee and the customer can both wear cloth face coverings and the service doesn't involve touching the customer's face.)
- Car Wash
- Restaurants and Cafés, including for On-Site Dining

CLOSED FOR NOW

- Nail Salons and Massage Parlors

Healthcare Services

CAN BE OPEN

- Clinics, Hospitals, Dental Clinics, Physical Therapy and Chiropractic Offices, Optometrists, Mental or Behavioral Health Providers, and other Healthcare Settings
